





In closing ,we wanted to share a bit about our vision for this next chapter of our lives., and our personality as a family. We are hoping to have a couple children because we feel that it is good for kids to grow up with siblings. So your child may be the first child, but not the only child we welcome into our home.

When we moved to Texas the beginning of 2014, we sold our home in New Mexico, but decided to rent until we got to know our new community a little better and could decide where we wanted to be. Currently, we are living in a 2100 sq ft. 4 bedroom, 2 bath house with a fenced backyard in a quiet neighborhood that is walking distance to the top elementary and middle schools in town. We have discussed possibly purchasing this home because we like the community feel and the children playing in the streets like when we were kids. We have also discussed the possibility of purchasing a piece of land near town where we could build a home and have a small farm with animals. We will see how the Lord leads us...

In preparation for having children we have worked on a solid financial plan.
